# THINGS TO REMEMBER AND REFLECT ON IN NOVEMBER:

**Nov 1, 1848** - The first medical school for women opened in Boston.

**Nov 4, 1979** - About 500 young Iranian militants stormed the U.S. Embassy in Teheran, Iran, and took 90 hostages, including 52 Americans.

**Nov 6, 1860** - Abraham Lincoln was elected as the 16th U.S. President and the first Republican.

**Nov 7, 1811** – Shawnee Indians defeated the at the Battle of Tippecanoe

**Nov 7, 1837** - A pro-slavery mob attacked and killed American abolitionist Elijah Lovejoy at his printing works in Alton, Illinois.

**Nov 8, 1942** - Operation Torch, the Allied landings in North Africa, began as 400,000 soldiers under the command of General Dwight D. Eisenhower landed at Morocco and Algeria

**Nov 9, 1989** - The Berlin Wall was opened after standing for 28 years. The 27.9 mile wall had been constructed in 1961.

**Nov 10, 1775** - The U.S. Marine Corps was established as part of the U.S. Navy. It became a separate unit on July 11, 1789.

**Nov 11th** - Veterans Day (formerly called Armistice Day) celebrated.

**Nov 11, 1972** - Direct American military participation in the Vietnam War ends.

**Nov 13, 1942** - The five Sullivan Brothers were lost in the sinking of the cruiser *USS Juneau* off Guadalcanal causing the U.S. Navy to prohibit close relatives from serving on the same ship.

**Nov 13, 1956** - The U.S. Supreme Court ruled that racial segregation on public buses was unconstitutional.

**Nov 15, 1864** - Union troops under General William T. Sherman captured Atlanta.

**Nov 15, 1969** - 250,000 people gathered in Washington, D.C., to protest the Vietnam War.

**Nov 19, 1863** - President Abraham Lincoln delivered the Gettysburg Address

**Nov 19-20, 1990** - The Cold War ended as leaders of NATO and the Warsaw Pact signed a Treaty on Conventional Forces in Europe

Nov 20, 1943 - The Battle of Tarawa began.

Nov 20, 1962 - The Cuban Missile Crisis ended.

**Nov 22, 1963** – President Kennedy assassinated in Dallas, Texas

**Nov 25, 1863** - The Battle of Missionary Ridge – Union forces soldiers assaulted and overran Confederate army.

**Nov 26, 1789** - The first American holiday, proclaimed by President George Washington to be Thanksgiving Day, a day of prayer and public thanksgiving in gratitude for the successful establishment of the new American republic.

Nov 29, 1864 – Sand Creek Massacre - Without orders, Colorado Volunteer Infantry and Cavalry led by Col John Chivington attacked and killed at least 400 Cheyenne and Arapahoe Indians

# OUR NOVEMBER GUEST SPEAKER WILL BE HENRY HERNANDEZ

Henry Hernandez was born in Lockhart, Texas. He joined the U.S. Marine Corps in 1963. He served two tours of duty in Vietnam, 1965 – 1967. He received numerous awards and recognition during his military service. Following his honorable discharge from the Marine Corps in 1969, he joined the Marine Corps Reserve unit in Austin, Texas.

While attending school, he worked with the Texas Department of Transportation Mapping and Photogrammetry Department, flying low-altitude aerial photography. He worked for three years with the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers Survey Department. Most of his career was in surveying and mapping, including high-altitude aerial photo image interpretation for the Department of Defense. He

worked on many government projects in the U.S. and overseas. He retired from the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California Engineering Department in 2003.

Henry will be making a presentation at the November 21 dinner meeting on "The Grunt Padre", the service and sacrifice of the late Father Vincent Robert Capodanno, Vietnam 1966 – 1967.

Vincent R. Capodanno was a U.S. Navy chaplain who earned the Medal of Honor while serving with the Marines during the Vietnam War. He joined the U.S. Navy Chaplain Corps in 1966 and, after completing Officer Candidate School, was immediately posted to Vietnam, where he was attached to the U.S. Marines Corps. During his service Capodanno established a reputation for selfless dedication to the men, sharing their hardships and working for their spiritual and practical welfare. He was so beloved by the men that he acquired the moniker "The Grunt Padre."

On September 4, 1967, Capodanno embedded himself with one of the companies taking part in the mission. During a bloody firefight, Capodanno repeatedly exposed himself to retrieve wounded soldiers, deliver last rites, and bring comfort and aid in the heat of the battle. Capodanno was severely wounded twice and refused treatment or requests to withdraw. Finally, going to aid a wounded medical corpsman under enemy fire, he was killed in action. His posthumous Medal of Honor was presented to his family on January 7, 1969.

# MEMBER SPOTLIGHT – PAST PRESIDENT, COL WILLIAM HENRY MILNOR, JR, M.D.



Bill was born into a military family; his dad, William Henry Milnor, graduated from the United States Military Academy on June 6, 1944 (D-Day), became a pilot and served 23 years in United States

Air Force. So Bill experienced a lot of moves at a young age.

Bill graduated high school in Starkville, Mississippi. After high school, he earned a Biology degree from the University of the South, in Sewanee, Tennessee (TN). After graduating, he was accepted into the Baylor College of Medicine in Houston where he earned his Doctor of Medicine (MD). It was while here that Bill started becoming a Texan. From Houston, Col Milnor moved to Memphis, TN and completed his surgical internship.

After his internship, Bill entered the United States Army in 1972 and served 3 years (1972-1975) as an artillery brigade surgeon and then clinic commander in Wertheim, Germany. Next, from 1975-1978, he received Orthopaedic Surgical Residency training at Walter Reed Army Medical Center. After Walter Reed, his "fun" assignment (1978-1979) was at the Ft Campbell, KY hospital with the 101st Airborne Division, where he earned his Air Assault Wings! Then 1979-1980 and 1982-1983 he had fellowships in Hand and Micro-surgery.

From 1980-1987 Bill was assigned as Faculty Orthopaedic Surgeon, Brooke Army Medical Center. In 1987, he returned to Germany as Chief Orthopaedic Surgeon and Chief Surgeon at Landstuhl Army Medical Center. In 1993, Col Milnor left Germany to become the Chief of Orthopaedic Surgical Residency Training, Tripler Army Medical Center, Hawaii.

During his assignments Colonel Milnor treated active duty, retired military members and dependents including those injured in combat in Vietnam, Grenada, the Middle East: also those pilots and spectators injured in the 1989 Ramstein (Germany) military airshow, and Russian civilians evacuated to Landstuhl after a major earthquake.

His last assignment (1993-1995) was in Washington, DC as Chief Orthopaedic and Surgery Consultant to the US Army Surgeon General with responsibility for force development and surgical residencies. Colonel Milnor retired in January 1995 after nearly 23 years of service. His awards and commendations include Surgeon General's "A" the MOS (professional military occupational specialty designation), the Commendation Medal, Meritorious Service Medal and Legion of Merit. Professional memberships include the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons, American College of Surgery, and American Society for Surgery of the Hand.

After Army retirement, Bill entered private practice of Orthopaedic and hand surgery with another retired Army Colonel (who trained Bill) in Owensboro, KY. Then from 2005-2018 Col Milnor entered administrative practice of surgical utilization review out of Dallas, TX, with multiple medical and surgical specialists.

While Colonel Milnor was an Orthopaedic surgeon and teacher at Brooke Army Medical Center in San Antonio, he met and married Gerry Caperton of Stockdale, Texas.

# **COMMENDATION**

The Congressional Veteran Commendation is a nominations-based program designed to recognize **both** the military service and community service of Veterans living in the 31<sup>st</sup> Congressional District of Texas. These honorees are exceptional Americans who served our country as a former member of the United States Armed Forces (Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Space Force and Coast Guard).

Rep. Pete Sessions was host and one of many present who honored the 2024 Heart of Texas recipients of the Congressional Veterans Commendation on Friday night, October 11. The event took place at the Lee Lockwood Library, located at 2801 W Waco Drive.

The event started with an invocation by Chaplain William Brock, and a Presentation of the Colors by La Vega High School's Navy JROTC.

The keynote speaker for the dinner was Lt. Gen. Kevin D. Admiral, who is the Commanding General of III Armored Corps and Fort Cavazos. According to the Office of Pete Sessions, Lt. Gen. Admiral has led soldiers at all levels across four divisions in the United States and overseas.

There were eight recipients of the Congressional Veterans Commendation. Three were Heart of Texas Chapter MOAA members. They were Robert Rochell, Jimmie Hanes, and Harold Rafuse.
